The Reverend Dr. Matthew Covington

With pleasure today we welcome The Reverend Dr. Matthew Covington and his wife Ann.

Matthew and Ann (Garner) Covington met as students at Davidson College. Matthew was a senior, and Editor of *The Davidsonian* newspaper. Ann was a freshman who quickly earned a byline. In fact, Ann would later edit *The Davidsonian* herself. Matthew and Ann were married in June, 1980. Two weeks later, Matthew enrolled in Greek School at Columbia Theological Seminary, and Ann began training to be a paralegal assistant. Ann worked primarily in insurance defense. During his theological studies, Matthew took intern positions at the First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta and at the Druid Hills Presbyterian Church. He finished the Doctor of Ministry degree at Columbia in 1984.

Matthew was the recipient of a graduate exchange fellowship with Westminster College in Cambridge, England. He and Ann lived there during the 1984-85 academic year. Matthew's special interests of study in Cambridge were biblical theology and Christology. Ann studied architectural history. Upon their return to the U.S., Matthew was called to be the Associate Pastor for Outreach and Evangelism at the White Memorial Presbyterian Church in Raleigh, N.C. Matthew and Ann have also served the First Presbyterian Church of Natchez, MS, and Seven Oaks Presbyterian in Columbia, S.C. Matthew has been the Pastor of The Presbyterian Church of Bowling Green since January, 2003.

Matthew's ministry in Bowling Green has been marked by careful, biblical preaching and teaching, by pastoral care extended widely in the church and the community, and by a sharpened focus on the outreach/mission of the church.

In 2022, Matthew and Ann returned to Westminster College, Cambridge for a three-month sabbatical. Matthew's study was concerned with identifying creative responses for the church to our secularized society.

Matthew and Ann are the parents of two exceptional daughters, Claire Duren and Elizabeth Leverette. Claire and her husband, Grant, are the parents of Hewitt (6) and Clark (5). Elizabeth and Marlowe are the parents of James (5). Matthew officiated at both of his daughter's weddings, and at each of the three boys' baptisms.
